A Portrait of a Profane Person  
Full Stomach, Empty Future

Gen. 25:27-34



**Hebrews 12:16** Lest there be any fornicator, or profane person, as Esau, who for one morsel of meat sold his birthright.  
**Profane**- a lack of holiness. If you take something holy and good, and treat it with contempt, then you have profaned it. To treat the things of God as ordinary is to profane or despise them. It shows a lack of godliness.

In Genesis 25, we see three characteristics that paint “**A Portrait of a Profane Person**” from the life of Esau.

**Profane people do not value what God values, You must!**

- I. **Profane People are Nearsighted.**
  - A. **Esau traded his privileged position for pottage.**
  - B. **Esau traded future peace for present satisfaction.**
- II. **Profane People are Powerless.**
  - A. **Esau was powerless to resist temptation.**
  - B. **Esau was powerless to respect his birthright.**
- III. **Profane People are Cheap.**
  - A. **Esau Valued Invaluable things.**
  - B. **Esau's Priorities were backwards.**
    1. He preferred the present to the future.
    2. He preferred the sensual to the spiritual.
    3. He preferred the near and certain to the far and probable.

**Profane people do not treasure what God treasures, You must!**

Did Scripture just paint a portrait of you? Examine yourself tonight. Do you exhibit nearsightedness by selling your future for your present satisfaction? Are you powerless to resist temptation? Are you bought cheaply because you place value on the wrong things? The world rushes on today, giving little thought to God and His daily purpose for each of our lives. But we are children of God. Let us never forget, not for an hour, that God and His promises are holy. He expects our lives to reflect that awareness. His promises have set us apart.

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
