The Bible Proclaims and Displays that God gives Grace.

Definition: The word translated as grace is typically the word *karis. Karis* means favor, grace, kindness, goodwill, gracious deed or gift. The condition of goodwill and resulting act of kindness.

- **2 Cor. 9:8** And God is able to make all grace abound toward you; that ye, always having all sufficiency in all things, may abound to every good work:
- **2 Cor. 12:8-10** For this thing I besought the Lord thrice, that it might depart from me. 9 And he said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me. 10 Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses for Christ's sake: for when I am weak, then am I strong.
- **Eph. 1:6-7** To the praise of the glory of his grace, wherein he hath made us accepted in the beloved. 7 In whom we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of his grace:
- **Heb. 4:16** Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need.
- 1 Peter 5:5b-7 ...be clothed with humility: for God resisteth the proud, and giveth grace to the humble. 6 Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that he may exalt you in due time: 7 Casting all your care upon him; for he careth for you.
- 1 Peter 5:10 But the God of all grace, who hath called us unto his eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after that ye have suffered a while, make you perfect, stablish, strengthen, settle you.
