

Romans 8:32-33

God did not spare His Son, Jesus Christ. He met man's greatest need by delivering Him up as the most precious gift. Without Christ, man is hopelessly lost in his sin. God gives man hope when he places his faith in the substitutional death and resurrection of Christ. There is no greater gift than Jesus Christ Himself. Since God has already given man the most valuable gift, what reason do we have to doubt He will continue show that same faithfulness in the future? God did not hesitate to meet our greatest need with His greatest gift. Certainly He can be counted on to freely meet all of our needs with lesser gifts!

In verse 33 Paul takes us into a court room to circle back to the point he made in Romans 8:1, "There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus,". He again uses a rhetorical question to emphasize that no one can be successful in accusing someone whom God has declared righteous. No one can condemn a believer because Christ has already been condemned in his place. The punishment for our sin has already been handed out on the cross. That is our confident hope! No one can charge anything upon the believer's account because it has been paid in full by Jesus! God has justified!
